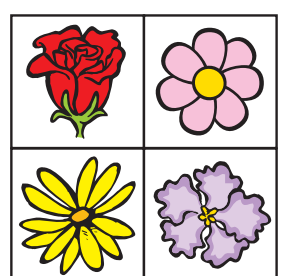

The Egg in the Bottle Trick!

Science is really EGGSciting!



Materials for Experiment:



strip of newspaper about 1" x 8"

EASTER BUNNY SCIENTIST'S NOTEBOOK

NOTE: This experiment requires an adult assistant!

QUESTION: Can you make an egg drop into an empty bottle if the neck is smaller than the egg?

HYPOTHESIS: What I think will happen:

METHOD:

1. Have an adult light the paper and drop it into the glass bottle.
2. Quickly place the peeled, hard-boiled egg on the opening of the glass bottle.
3. The fire will eventually burn out.

OBSERVATION: Describe what happens to the egg.

CONCLUSION: Explain what this experiment taught you.

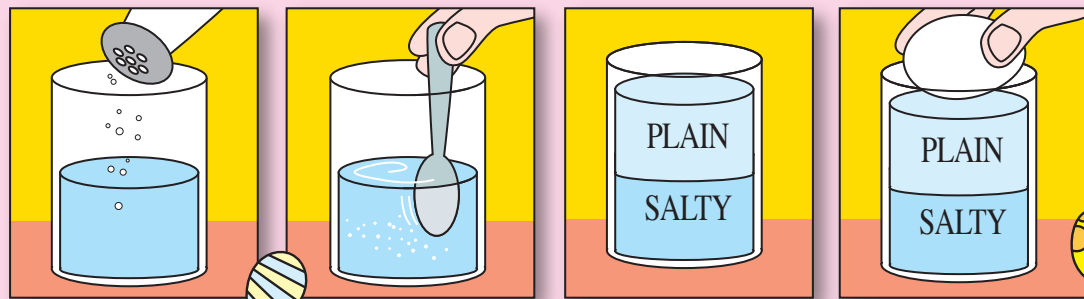
MORE EGGSTRAORDINARY SCIENCE!

Can you make an egg float?



No, but I can make a root beer float!

If you gently put an egg into a glass of tap water, it will sink to the bottom. But here's an experiment that will make an egg float.



Pour water into a glass about half way. Add 10 tablespoons of salt.

Stir gently until salt dissolves completely.

Carefully add plain water until the glass is nearly full, but try not to mix the plain and salt water much.

Gently place the egg in the glass of water. What happens?

ANSWER: The egg drops through the plain water until it reaches the salty water. Now, when it reaches the salt water, it will magically float in the middle of the glass! Why? Salt water is denser than tap water. If a liquid is denser, it is easier for an object to float.

OPINIONS refer to a particular person's (or group's) feeling, thought, judgment, belief, estimate, and/or anything that is not 100% true and can't be proven.

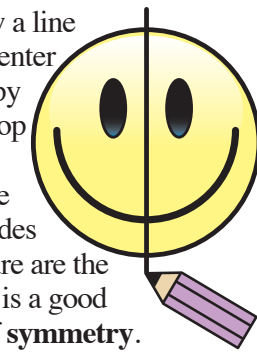

Matching Sides

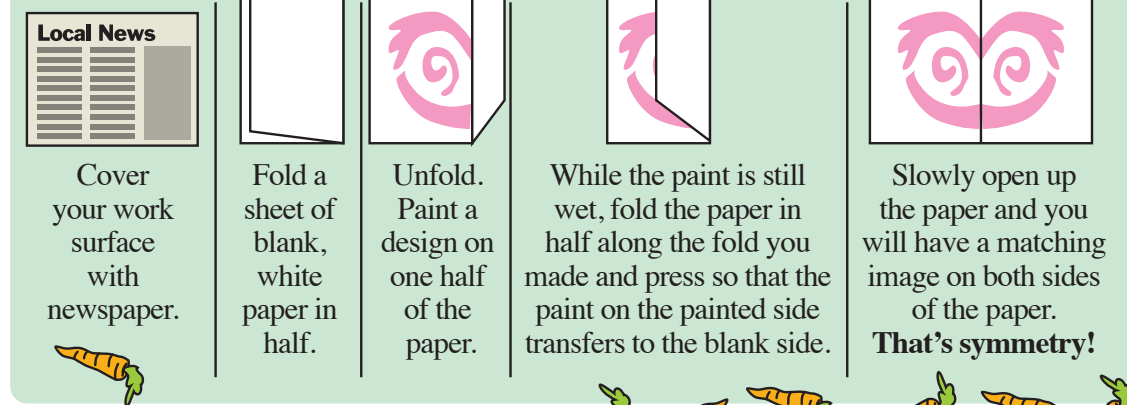
If you draw a line down the center of this happy face from top to bottom, you will see that both sides of the picture are the same. This is a good example of **symmetry**.



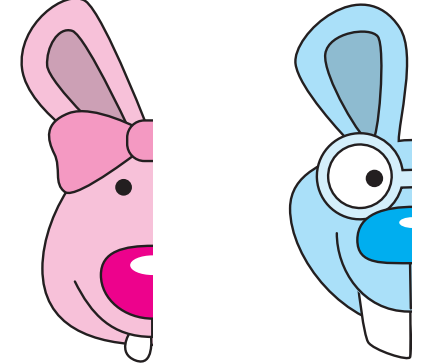

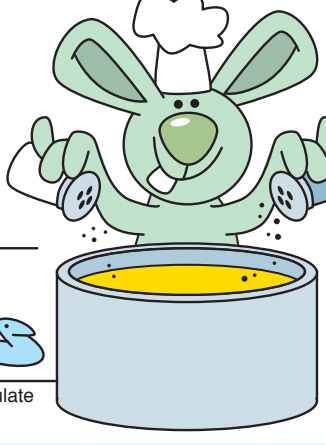
